The Napa Valley Vintners is investing in 29 nonprofit partners who are both essential to the recovery of the region and who supply ongoing basic needs.

Aldea Inc. \$635,000

Aldea Children & Family Services improves the lives of the people they serve by providing professional behavioral interventions, child welfare and family support services in a manner that respects and supports the dignity and individuality of each person.

Community Health Initiative (CHI) Napa County \$250,000

CHI's mission is to improve the health of children and their families residing in Napa County by improving access to healthcare services through health insurance enrollment, education, advocacy and resource support.

Cope Family Center \$400,000

Cope's mission is to empower parents, nurture children and strengthen communities by providing parents with the education, resources and support they need to raise children who thrive.

Immigration Institute of the Bay Area \$75,000

The Immigration Institute of the Bay Area helps immigrants and their families join and contribute to the community. IBBA provides high-quality legal services, education and civic engagement opportunities at low or no cost.

NEWS- Domestic Violence & Sexual Abuse Services \$245,000

NEWS is dedicated to providing safety, hope, healing and empowerment for survivors of domestic and sexual abuse.

Planned Parenthood: Northern California \$230,000

Planned Parenthood provides clients with information to make well-informed decisions about sexuality, family planning and childbearing, with an emphasis on teen pregnancy and STD-HIV prevention.

Puertas Abiertas \$100,000

The mission of Puertas Abiertas is to work hand in hand with Latinos to achieve healthy lifestyles, self-sufficiency and opportunities for leadership and community engagement.

Rianda Senior Center Association \$90,000

Rianda House is a thriving up-valley senior activity center, offering a one-stop shop approach to connecting the community's senior population to the programs, services and resources needed to support independence and successful aging.

Collabria Care \$500,000

Collabria Care is committed to providing professional healthcare, expert resources and compassionate support to individuals and their loved ones experiencing the transitions of aging, serious illness or facing the end of life.

Mentis \$450,000

The Mentis mission is to provide affordable, bi-lingual, and professional mental health services for people of all ages living in Napa County by servicing all demographic sectors.

Up Valley Family Centers \$400,000

UpValley Family Centers provides early childhood development programs, youth mentoring, guided referrals and application assistance, case management, legal services, civic engagement, emergency housing assistance, and other services toward self-sufficiency for up-valley Napa Valley residents.

OLE Health \$800,000

OLE Health's Napa Valley Vintners South Napa Campus is the medical home to more than 37,000 Napa County patients, impacting one in four children and one in six adults. In addition, OLE Health is the largest provider of dental services for low-income families in Napa County.

Queen of the Valley Foundation \$550,000

With this grant, the Queen of the Valley hospital will increase capacity of their Level 111 trauma center by with 7 micro beds to serve as infectious disease isolation units, create two isolated units for those awaiting diagnostic results, and disinfecting robot dedicated to the trauma center.

St. Helena Hospital Foundation \$375,000

The Adventist Health Acute Stroke Ready Program will be the only stroke program in the upper Napa Valley. This program is targeted for lifesaving care for potential 2,600 residents who are at significant risk.

10,000 Degrees \$78,000

The mission of 10,000 Degrees is to achieve educational equity and support students from low-income backgrounds to get to and through college in order to positively impact their communities and the world.

Aim High for High School \$80,000

Keeping students engaged in enrichment programs over the summer can ease the transition to adolescence and make the difference in school success.

Boys and Girls Clubs of Napa Valley \$350,000

Offers young people what they need and want most: adults who respect and listen to them, a safe environment where they can be themselves and have fun while participating in interesting and constructive activities.

Boys and Girls Clubs of St. Helena and Calistoga \$200,000

Help children reach their full potential through programs that promote academic success, good character, citizenship and healthy lifestyles.

Child Start, Inc. \$100,000

By providing high quality, comprehensive and family-focused early childhood services, Child Start supports the educational, social and emotional development of children.

Community Resources for Children \$100,000

Provides programming and support to promote quality early learning environments and experiences for children at home, in childcare, in preschool and throughout the community.

Napa Valley Education Foundation \$250,000

The mission of the Napa Valley Education Foundation is to support teachers, students and public schools to ensure all students are engaged and prepared for success in college, career and life.

NapaLearns \$275,000

Encourages the success of every student by providing resources, funding and thought leadership to help school district staff adopt innovations focused on the demands of the future.

The Pediatric Dental Initiative (PDI) \$75,000

PDI provides oral surgery under anesthesia to treat children with severe tooth decay, while offering oral health education, screenings and dental coverage assistance.

Lilliput Children's Services \$60,000

Lilliput Children's Services provides foster adoption services, post-adoption services, workshops and trainings for parents and professional development for child welfare and mental health professionals.

Girls on the Run Napa \$60,000

Girls participate in a 10-week session to create a stronger sense of self and a life skills tool kit so that they are better prepared to make healthy life choices, avoid risky behaviors and maintain higher self-esteem.

CASA, A Voice for Children \$60,000

CASA volunteers are often the only consistent person in the child's life throughout the entire time the child is in foster care, providing advocacy, support and mentorship.

Nimbus Arts \$60,000

Nimbus Arts mission believes in the power of art to educate and empower community members of all ages, ethnicities and socioeconomic backgrounds by offering a range of free community programming and scholarships.

On the Move \$400,000

Co-creates culturally relevant programs with children, youth and adults that meaningfully contribute to the issues that meet their most pressing needs, including VOICES, Youth Leadership Academies, Parent University and LGBTQ Connection.

ParentsCAN \$155,000
